1. Purpose Title 22 Sec. 4.4 4.13	The Board recognizes its responsibility for the development, assessment and improvement of the educational program of the schools. To this end, the curriculum shall be evaluated, adapted and developed on a continuing basis and in accordance with a plan for curriculum improvement.
2. Definition Title 22 Sec. 4.3	For purposes of this policy, curriculum shall be defined as a series of planned instruction aligned with established academic standards in each subject that is coordinated, articulated and implemented in a manner designed to result in the achievement of academic standards at the proficient level by all students.
Title 22 Sec. 4.4, 4.12 Pol. 102 Title 22	The Board shall be responsible for approving the curriculum of the district's schools.
Sec. 4.4 4.12 Pol. 106	In order to provide a quality educational program for district students, the Board shall adopt a curriculum plan that includes the requirements for courses to be taught; subjects to be taught in the English language; courses adapted to the age, development and needs of students; and strategies for assisting those students having difficulty attaining the academic standards.

Title 22 Sec. 4.4 4.82	Within the educational setting, pilots of new textbooks grouping practices, courses, and programs may be implemented with the purpose of improving instructional outcomes. Requests to implement a pilot must be made to the superintendent. The request must identify the reason(s) for the pilot, objectives to be accomplished, evaluative criteria and costs. The Superintendent will prepare a recommendation and present the request to the Board. Approved pilots will require an initial, mid-point and final report made to the Board.
